


- Come for an hour or the day (bring your lunch!)

*My new book *Weaving Pattern Bands: How to Create and Design with 5, 7 and 9 Pattern Threads* is published by Schiffer Press this month. It has over 140 pattern motifs with ideas for combining them to create your own unique design. They can be woven using an inkle loom, a standard heddle or the double slotted heddle.*
